3. Paul and the Holy Spirit in Pauline Epistles

1. Lecture Overview

Paul describes the Holy Spirit as the life and power of God given through the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

4) The Spirit and Sanctification

- (1) Romans 8- "Those who walk according to the Spirit, not according to the flesh."
- (2) The Spirit transforms the life of believers into holiness.
- (3) Sanctification is not achieved by human effort but by the power of the Spirit.

5) The Spirit and the Christian Community

(1) 1 Corinthians 12- Spiritual gifts, unity in diversity, building up the church.

- (2) The Spirit gives various gifts but unites all members into one body.
- (3) True Christian fellowship is maintained by the Spirit.

6) The Spirit and Mission

- (1) Paul's missionary journeys were directed by the Spirit. (See Acts 16:6-7)
- (2) The Spirit empowers gospel preaching, performs miracles, and grants boldness in suffering.
- (3) Mission without the Spirit becomes mere activity, not transformation.
