1) Course Description

The Comprehensive Exam evaluates whether the student has attained a thorough and integrated understanding of the theological curriculum.

It especially measures the student's depth of knowledge in Pauline Theology, their ability to interpret Scripture accurately, and their overall theological reasoning.

2) Objectives of the Exam

- (1) To assess the student's integrated understanding of the entire theological curriculum
- (2) To evaluate the ability to accurately interpret and apply the core themes of Pauline Theology
- (3) To confirm the student's readiness for ministry, further academic study, or teaching

3) Exam Structure

- (1) Essay-based questions
- (2) Oral examination or theological interview (as applicable)
- (3) Exegesis of selected biblical texts
- (4) Use of reference materials may be permitted based on institutional policy

4) Passing Criteria

- (1) Minimum passing score: 80 out of 100
 - (2) High level of accuracy required in core areas of Pauline Theology
 - (3) Logical articulation and sound biblical interpretation are essential

- (1) Review the entire curriculum before the exam
- (2) Organize and summarize key concepts in Pauline Theology
- (3) Take mock exams to simulate the testing environment
