- ② Romans 3:24-25: "...through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus..."
- 3 2 Corinthians 5:21: "God made him who had no sin to be sin for us..."

3) Resurrection and Exaltation

- 1 Corinthians 15: The historical and theological meaning of the resurrection
- ② Romans 1:4: "...declared with power to be the Son of God by his resurrection from the dead..."
- 3 Philippians 2:9-11: "...that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow..."

4) The Lordship of Christ

- ① Romans 10:9: "If you declare with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord'..."
- 2 1 Corinthians 8:6: "...one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom all

things came..."

5) Christ and the Church

- ① Ephesians 1:22-23: "...appointed him to be head over everything for the church..."
- ② 1 Corinthians 12:27: "Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it."

3. The Christ-Centered Gospel

- 1) Galatians 2:20: "...Christ lives in me."
- 2) Romans 8:1-4: Christ who fulfilled the Law
- 3) Justification, sanctification, and glorification all flow through Christ
